THE COURSE:

The course is a 3.9-mile clockwise circuit on the outskirts of Hillsdale. There will be a rolling start from Field of Dreams on North Hillsdale Rd. Riders will turn left on Moore Rd, and begin the race. Moore Rd starts downhill, then there is a gradual, but challenging uphill section before turning on to Homer Rd. There is a slight up hill after turning on to Ball Rd, then a downhill section on North Hillsdale Rd leading up to an uphill finish on the corner of North Hillsdale and Moore Rd. The hills will be a factor late in the race, but still expect exciting sprint finishes!

TERRY'S STORY:

Terry was born Oct. 1, 1959 in Reading, PA. He graduated from Wilson High School in West Lawn, PA. Upon graduation, Terry received a B.S. in Education, German, and French from Millersville State University in 1981. He received his M.A. in German from Penn State in 1984 and Ph.D. in German from State University of New York-Albany in 1992.

Before teaching at Hillsdale College, Terry had a Fulbright Teaching Assistantship in Braunschweig Germany in 1983 and Lectureship in Germany at the University of Wurzburg in 1986. From 1988 until his death, Terry taught German at Hillsdale College and will be remembered by students as a fine teacher with an engaging personality. Highlights of his career include summer sessions in the German Department's overseas program and Seminars on Holocaust Literature. Terry also has a recently published book, *Hitler's Hostages*, which he co-wrote with Charles E. Harrar.

Terry married his wife, Maria, in 1983 and their only son, Sebastian, was born in 1991. Terry's hobbies included house renovation, woodwork, watching NASCAR and playing golf. Terry was also a very gifted photographer, and most of his energy in the last few years was spent following the Hillsdale High School Cross Country team, with son Sebastian being a member.

Just weeks before his death, on November 1, 2008, Terry had the pleasure of watching his son, Sebastian, along with all of his teammates, run personal best races at the State Cross Country meet en-route to finishing second as a team by one-tenth of a second. The spectacular performance by the entire team brought an end to the best single season in the history of Hillsdale High School's Men's Cross Country Team.

Just before passing away as a result of cancer related complications, Terry was promoted to Full Professor of German in acknowledgement of his many contributions to the college. The promotion was an honor that Terry had dedicated his entire life toward achieving. Terry passed away on November 21, 2008 in his home with family and friends by his side.
